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1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to promote a climate of learning in the classroom by having students dress in a uniform manner.

2. SCOPE

This policy applies to all NMIS students

3. REFERENCES/RELATED policies

none

4. RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4.1. It is the responsibility of the parents/guardians of NMIS students to provide clothing in compliance with this policy.
- 4.2. It is the responsibility of the NMIS School Advisory Council (SAC) to determine if a family cannot afford to purchase a uniform and to provide for that family accordingly. NMIS administration to enforce this policy.
- 4.3. NMIS administration to enforce this policy, and change this policy as circumstances warrant.

5. DEFINITIONS

5.1. "School Colors" mean navy blue, gold and red

5.2. "School Logo" means this symbol:



6. POLICY

6.1. Shirts

6.1.1. Shirts must be of solid color, in navy blue, gold or red and be of the following style:

6.1.1.1 Short or long sleeved polo

6.1.1.2 Short or long sleeved oxford

6.1.1.3 Turtleneck



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6.1.2. Shirts must bear school logo and are only to be purchased by families at a school-approved uniform vendor.

6.2. Sweatshirts and Sweaters

6.2.1. Sweatshirts and Sweaters must be in either the school colors or tan.

6.2.2. Sweatshirts or Sweaters must bear school logo and are only to be purchased by families at a school-approved uniform vendor.

6.2.3. Uniform sweatshirts and/or sweaters may be worn above school uniform shirts.

6.3. Pants

6.3.1 Pants must be either solid khaki or solid navy blue. Pants must be from “uniform section” of a retail store.

6.3.1.1. Administration will annually provide a list of acceptable uniform pant providers.

6.3.2 The following are not permitted, even if they come from a “uniform section” of a retail store:

6.3.2.1 Denim pants

6.3.2.2 Cargo pants

6.3.2.3 Capri or “3/4” pants

6.3.2.4 Stretchy, or yoga-type pants

6.4 Shorts and Skorts

6.4.1 Shorts and skorts must be either solid khaki or solid navy blue.

6.4.2 Shorts and skorts must reach at least to mid-thigh in length.

6.4.3 Shorts and skorts must be from the “uniform section” of a retail store.

6.4.3.1 Administration will annually provide a list of acceptable uninform short/skort providers.



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6.5 Footwear

- 6.5.1 All footwear must be closed-toed.
- 6.5.2 Heel of footwear may not be more than one-inch in height.
- 6.5.3 Students must wear shoes at all times.

6.6 Headwear

- 6.6.1 Hats are not permitted in the building.

6.7 Jackets and outerwear

- 6.7.1 Jackets and outerwear are not permitted in the building.

6.8 Specific Restrictions

- 6.8.1 Dresses and jumpers are not permitted.
- 6.8.2 “Heelys”, or any wheeled shoe is not permitted.
- 6.8.3 Spikes or chains are not permitted.
- 6.8.4 Flip-flops, or backless shoes are not permitted.
- 6.8.5 Rubber slip on shoes are not permitted.
