# This Week's Grade-by-Grade Update

## Kindergarten

Students will continue exploring the invention process. They will be planning and building their inventions. Students will do a science activity that will deepen their exploration of the sun's energy.

This week in Language Arts, students will work with syllables with "u" and do various reading comprehension exercises.

In Everyday Math, the kids will practice addition in activity that uses popsicle sticks to represent sums in many different ways. They will play an addition game called the "plus/minus" game. Students will also practice tens and be introduced to the term "decade" in an activity that counts decades.

The Students will take their spring Istation (reading) tests this Thursday.

The spring violin concert will be this Friday. We can't wait to hear how far the kids have come!

### **First Grade**

This week, we will continue with our final line of inquiry on the features of maps and timelines. Our focus will be on different types of maps, culminating in the creation of

individual books inspired by the title "Yo en el mapa" by Joan Sweeney, which uses the concentric circle concept of home, neighborhood, city, state, country, continent, and world. We will also use read aloud





time to learn more about how to use map keys and directions to locate places and reach destinations. We will also introduce the kids to a scavenger hunt so they can get hands-on practice! Our vocabulary words are: *mapa*, *clave*, *rosa*, *calle*, *continente*, y *mundo*.

We embark ourselves into a very busy, but exciting week! We hope to see you on Monday May 7<sup>th</sup> for curriculum night. Our 3rd grade teachers will be giving you a synopsis of what is coming next school year. Also, don't forget that our spring violin concert is on Friday May 11, see you there!

In the classroom this week we will continue with our IB Unit How We Organize Ourselves. As the students learn more about communities around the world and transportation systems they will be taking an adventure around the world on paper. One of the activities this week will be documenting a fictional journey on a personal diary that will include a surprise transportation system. We will be also using our leveled readers booklets to learn about the different rules and safety procedures when they are walking

on the street, riding a bike, a car, a bus, and a skateboard

For social studies students will be reading about the ways that goods from other countries get to the United States and vice versa. Our informational article for the week will be "Los países comercian y transportan bienes"

In science we will continue with the energy unit. We will keep exploring the concept that energy makes heat is. Students will be working with special pieces of paper that have some "mysterious" properties. These "mysterious" properties will react different at the exposure of any type of heat.

In math we will start teaching the basics of the concept of division. Students will practice how to solve division number stories. We will also review and practice multiplying by 2, 5 and 10. Finally, this week in





math we will introduce 1s and 0s multiplication facts and we will guide our second graders to discover patterns in multiplication facts.

**IB:** Students have begun their focused research on a U.S. city. They have seen examples of brochures and know what elements should be included. Things like: popular attractions, local cuisine, climate, general history, etc.

**Math:** Students will wrap up Unit 9 with an assessment. In Unit 10, we will learn and practice solving 2-digit by 2-digit multiplication. Students will be introduced to the concept of volume.

**Science:** Students will learn about Mohs Hardness Scale and how its used to determine a mineral's relative hardness. Students may bring in a rock sample or two (please not too many all at once) to share with the class. They should be able to tell other what each rock is.

**IB:** The students have started working on their scientific method projects, pertaining to the energy of their choosing.

**Science:** The students have started their research on their projects. By the end of the week the students will be presenting to the class, as well as other grade levels. They may get materials from home, work on experiments at home too, but the work needs to be done by the student.

**Social Studies:** The students will learn about the history of all the types of energy and how they "came to be." Be sure to ask them all about it!

**Math:** Entering into Unit 10-11. Unit 10 pertains to lines and reflections, and Unit 11 is all about weights and the measurement of:

volume. As always, please review multiplication, division, fractions, decimals, and percentage facts at home!

Literacy: The students will use the same vocabulary from last week, and then they will take the higher of the 2 scores. The English "regular" words for this week are: vary, trial, data, method, theory, analysis, variable, procedure, independent, dependent, evaluate, overview, scientist, experiment, and conclusion. The English "bonus" words for this week are: qualitative, quantitative, inference, extraneous, and scientific.

The Spanish words/phrases for the week are: *cambiar*, *prueba* experimental, datos, estilo, análisis, variable, procedimiento, científico/a, y conclusión.


