First Grade

This week, we will begin wrapping up our IB unit on How We Express Ourselves by reviewing our central idea that "Weather and people's beliefs may influence traditions and events." We will spend inquiry time reviewing different traditional events from this time of year, along with symbols, beliefs, and weather conditions that are associated with them in this part of the world, culminating in a summative assessment project. In this project, students will create winter brochures to "advertise" the weather, traditions, and favorite celebrations in Albuquerque during this time of year. Our Spanish

vocabulary words are durante, invierno, alguna, favorita, celebrar, importante. Our English spelling words are: go, so, no, home, note, robe, do, you, who.

In math, we will begin Unit 6. This week, we will introduce a facts table, learn about equivalent names, and will then learn about fact families. At the end of the week, we will be making fact triangles to send home with the kids to practice addition and subtraction at home for more automaticity. Welcome back and we wish you the best in 2019!

In IB we are continuing in our unit of study "Who we are". Our second graders will be learning about New Mexico and traditions. They will also learn about the human body its function and how to stay healthy.

This week in Math, students will begin Unit 6. This unit focuses on solving word problems, 3 digit addition, estimating, and data graphs. We will begin multiplication and division problems with this unit.

In Social Studies, our students will learn about the Nervous system. We will learn about the state tree, the piñon. We will also continue learning about Ana Baca and read some of her books.

The students will continue improving their spelling, penmanship, and writing skills through dictation. The students will continue working with the same dictado this week: Saludo a la bandera del estado de Nuevo México. Es el símbolo zía de amistad perfecta entre culturas unidas.

How time flies! After break, the students will wrap up the IB unit "Where we are in place and time." Students will focus on the idea of cause and effect, with an emphasis on how the western region changed as a result of westward expansion. Students will work on their desert animal reports and take the summative assessment for the unit.

Students will begin unit 6 in Everyday Math this week. They will focus on multiplication and subtraction word problems and will practice different algorithms for division. It is crucial for the students to have their multiplication facts down in order to have success in division.

If you would like to work with your child during break, practice those times-tables and read, read, read! We wish all of our students and their families a peaceful, restful winter vacation!

Arabic language for fourth grade:

In the Arabic language for 4th grade we will continue the IB unit "Where We are in Place and Time". I will show them a picture about the Arab migration in the past. I will do a small project about Arab migration. I will start reading "My Body and Me and My Father" and





I will ask them questions and assign a worksheet related to the story, Besides this the students will review the shapes of the Arabic letters, parts of the body, the shapes, and the clothes in Arabic. 


